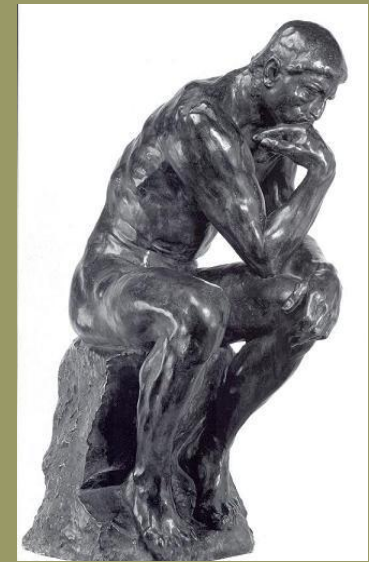

Things You Should Know About Being in Philosophy

1. There are many options for somebody with a Philosophy degree aside from graduate school. Studying philosophy promotes critical thinking, excellent writing skills, knowledge of valid argumentation, and other valuable transferable skills. Employees with degrees in Philosophy are found in all sectors of the job market, including journalism, government and public administration, law, computing, and education.
2. PHIL 210 – Introduction to Deductive Logic is a requirement for Honours and Majors students, as well as a requirement for many intermediate and advanced philosophy classes, so don't put off taking it until your final year! Logic tutoring is also available for anybody who needs help.
3. There is no need to apply for the Honours Program; so long as you declare Honours on Minerva, take the required courses, and keep a GPA of 3.0 or higher, you are in! Remember to get approval to take PHIL 301 and arrange for a thesis advisor before your final year!
4. Don't be afraid to ask for help from your professors, peers, and your executive PSA members. Drop by the Philosophy Lounge or a prof's office hours if you need some friendly guidance.
